# Portrait of a Principal – Mr. Preston, In His Own Words

Having been raised by two teachers, it was almost inevitable that at least one of their four children would choose education as a career path. I was the one to choose education and I began my career at Marysville High School, where I worked alongside my father, a math teacher, and Mrs. Lucas, who was then an Early Childhood Education teacher.

I was lucky enough to do my student teaching in a paid position; I long term substituted for an entire semester and taught English I, American Literature and Debate. In fact, that semester, Rich Eberle, PTSO Co-Treasurer, was a senior in my Debate class. The following year I was again lucky in that the teacher for whom I had substituted decided to work at another school and I received the position as a full time teacher.

I taught English classes, Speech and Debate for six years and was the English Department Chairperson for three years. Teaching Debate was my passion though, as I had been a debater while a student at Yuba City High School and received my Bachelor of Arts in Rhetoric and Communications from U.C. Davis. I can proudly say that each of the six years I coached debate, my students qualified for and competed in both the state and national tournaments; in fact, in 2001, one of my Policy Debate teams placed 10<sup>th</sup> at the state tournament.

My last year teaching, I had the luxury of

some extra prep periods because I was in charge of the WASC report and had a student teacher and suddenly, everything changed. We had an administrative change midyear and I was asked to step into the role of Teacher on Special Assignment as Assistant Principal. I stepped into it and the next year became a full time Assistant Principal. For six years I held that position and absolutely loved it, especially dealing with curriculum and testing and introducing programs into the school that helped students identify with school and develop a sense of belonging.

As I had always seen myself as a high school person, I never thought about being a principal because I saw how much stress was placed on the five principals I worked with during my twelve and a half years at MHS, but I knew that if I was going to continue to relish work and want to help others grow, I too would have to step out of my comfort zone and challenge myself. In a conversation with Dr. Todd, the superintendent, she suggested something I had never thought of—being an elementary school principal.

After much discussion with my family, friends and some coworkers, I decided to take the plunge and haven't looked back since. This is the end of my fourth year here at Arboga and I still can't believe how fortunate I have been to land in such an incredibly supportive school with such strong teachers, caring parents and support staff and willing students. I've traded being cursed at for being hugged, attending sporting events for curriculum nights, and struggling to help others see how important it is for kids to feel connected to school for trying to catch up with those who are light years ahead of me.

In all honesty, I have told several people that I feel I have the best job in the entire district and, in spite of expected and unexpected challenges here and there, I can't say that I would change a thing. This school and its community are special because of those who

are a part of it, because of how invested people are and how willing they are to make things work for kids.

# Solar Sparks win Lexus ECO Challenge!

Mrs. Jones' Sixth Grade Class entered a Lexus ECO Challenge statewide contest. There were three groups with nine students in each group: The Solar Sparks, Masters of Depletion and The H29 Scientists.

The contest was based on environmental issues. Each group had to research their topic, do a slide show, and contact other schools about issues, then they had to do a short video to send to the ECO Challenge.

One of the groups, The Solar Sparks, won the contest and a \$10,000.00 award! Each student received about \$700.00, the school received \$2,000, and the advisor received \$1,000.

We are now in a National Challenge and

could win up to \$30,000! Every student in Mrs. Jones participated and all did a wonderful job. Mrs. Jones is very proud of all her students for working so hard on how to improve our environment.

#### **Book Fair**

Irish writer Richard Steele once said, "Reading is to the mind what exercise is to the body." We all know that children need playtime and exercise, but children also need the creativity and knowledge that comes from reading a good book. Our library and our wonderful librarian Brenda West, together with Scholastic, put on our annual book fair once again this year during Open House week.

This year's book fair was an amazing success. We had approximately \$4,300 in overall sales and we gave almost \$1,200 worth of FREE books to our students and community members that participated! Thanks to those sales our library was able to purchase almost \$1000 worth of books to help expand our students' minds.

Every year we participate in Scholastic's "One for Books" program. Through this program we collect change during our book fair, which our library gets to use to purchase books. Scholastic Book Fairs matches the "One for Books" dollars we raise with a donation of their own - up to a million books given to three non-profit organizations devoted to helping families in need.

Mrs. West would like to once again thank all the volunteers that helped her this year with the book fair. She stressed that this book fair would never happen without such great parent participation.

## 4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup> Grade Science Challenge

What are the two main parts of an ecosystem? What breaks down organisms that are no longer living into simpler chemicals? How can shale, a sedimentary rock, be metamorphosed into slate? These were just a few of the many science questions that teams of students answered in the third annual Arboga Elementary 4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup> Grade Science Challenge.

The competition was held in the cafeteria on Tuesday, March 29<sup>th</sup>. The goal of this unique event is to provide a fun way for students in both grades to review the 4<sup>th</sup> grade science standards. The upcoming 5<sup>th</sup> grade state science exam includes questions on both 5<sup>th</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade science standards.



Teams of students represented their class in the competition and the winning team was awarded engaging science prizes that included a telescope, a variety of CSI kits and much more.

The teams of five students were chosen by their teacher for their science scores and their achievement on a test created specifically for this competition. Each classroom team of five was given an Arboga Science Challenge team t-shirt. Max Jeffrey, a junior at Marysville Charter Academy for the Arts, has designed the t-shirt for the past two years.

There were also opportunities for the student audience members to earn prizes. Student audience members were randomly chosen to answer science questions and those that answered correctly received a science prize.


